Rockefellers Enraged as Their World Crumbles

Oct. 22 (IPS) — In twin outbursts of infantile rage at the collapse of their economic and political empire, the Rockefeller brothers and flunkies yesterday hysterically demanded that their factional capitalist opposition fall into line.

David Rockefeller, in a speech before the European Community Chamber of Commerce in New York, admitted that European factions are breaking with the U.S. over economic relations with the Soviet Union and warned that "the basic unity of the community itself," is now at stake.

Taking aim at their opposition, Vice President Nelso Rockefeller, at his Domestic Council - sponsored forum in Denver on domestic policies, frantically demanded implementation of his \$100 billion dollar Energy Independence Agency boondoogle - a proposal which has been denounced in nearly every political quarter.

The intent of David's speech was evident even by its title, "World Trade at the Crossroads: The Importance of Atlantic Alliance." the aimed specifically at the European industrialists centered around the West German Christian Democratic Party (CDU) Gerhard Stoltenberg and the Italian industrialist Cefis, Rockefeller warned that detente has shifted East-West relations to an economic sphere which has "in turn resulted in a similar shift in European-American relations." Commercial, monetary and supply questions now overshadow old security issues and will continue to do so ... Unfortunately such matters tend to be

divisive. Moreover, their potential for divisiveness within the community (Atlantic Community-ed.) is further aggravated by the current weak state of the global economy. The slow pace of the recovery...the discord between North and South...are imposing major strains on the social fabric of our industrial democracies and the basic unity of the community itself.

Leading the Domestic Concil Policy Conference, Nelson pointed to the OPEC embargo and the Russian wheat deal as responsible for the deterioration of the U.S. economy, and together with the Domestic Concil demanded the development of labormassive intensive energy projects in the U.S. along with social services cutbacks at the federal level.
