

SCHLESINGER DISCUSSES LIMITED NUCLEAR WAR IN WEST GERMANY

Nov. 5 (IPS)--In reference to present negotiations between U.S. Secretary of Defense James Schlesinger and West German Chancellor Helmu Schmidt and his Defense Minister Georg Leber, a highly placed West German military official today told IPS that the governments of the United States and West Germany presently are preparing to violate international armaments limitation agreements signed in Paris in 1955. The official said: "You know Germany has nuclear delivery means capable of firing nuclear weapons....Yes, they are short- and medium-range."

Furthermore, the official revealed that the Schmidt government is prepared to see Western Europe destroyed in tactical nuclear warfare. This type of limited nuclear warfare is what Schlesinger has been pushing as a "conceptual breakthrough" for the Soviet Union since January. "Schlesinger is the most sensible man on the issues," the official said. He understands that "limited nuclear warfare may well be fought out on West German soil--but that is better than blowing up the whole world."

CANADA'S TRILATERAL LABOR REPRESENTATIVE

Nov. 5 (IPS)--In an exclusive interview with IPS, Research Director for the Canadian Labour Congress Russell Bell proudly volunteered the information that he is a member of the Trilateral Commission--the implementing arm for Rockefeller cabal policy. Bell bragged that he was chosen because of "contributions" he personally could make for the Rockefeller cabal. These included, at the last Trilateral Commission meeting, helping to set up a Trilateral group to brief Parliament.

When IPS asked Bell if there was a conflict of interest between his membership on the Trilateral Commission and his position on the Central Labour Congress, he reacted with amazement: "We have all kinds of committees where labor and management sit together to solve various economic problems. This has been going on for years. We have the British-North America Committee and the Canadian-America Committee."

Both committees are Rockefeller think-tanks, with representatives from Rockefeller-controlled companies and banks such as Chase Manhattan and First National City. The Canadian-American Committee, which boasts Trilateral Commission member I. W. Abel as its "labor" representative, produced a report on agriculture in 1970 which said Third World countries were doomed because it was "no longer profitable" for the developed countries to feed them.

Self-admittedly, Bell's job is to funnel the Trilateral line for implementation by the Labour Congress. His job, Bell said, is "...to make economic policy recommendations to chief officials here." Bell received his training at the government think-tank, the Economic Council, and he has had no connection to trade unionism. As he put it, "I never came up through the trade union ranks."

CANADIAN LABOUR FEDERATION CALLS FOR PARTICIPATION IN RECYCLING

TORONTO, Nov. 5 (IPS)--The President of the Ontario Federation of Labour Dave Archer opened up the OFL's conference Oct. 28 with a call for increased labor participation on Canada's manpower boards. Modelled after the Nazi Labor Front, these boards would facilitate relocation of workers into forced work projects.

Archer's plea for union collaboration in the recycling of the Canadian workforce was accompanied throughout the convention by the attempt to chain the approaching working class ferment to the corpse of the agent-ridden New Democratic Party (NDP). Bored delegates listened while Toronto Labour Council treasurer William Barker complained that "I go into working class homes and I can't even get them to put an NDP sign on their front lawn." About one-half of the delegates were reading the North American Labor Party declaration calling for immediate dismantling of the manpower boards and other Rockefeller agencies--like the National Emergency Planning Establishment, an alternative government apparatus for "emergencies."

The bureaucrats also maintained their torpor in the face of Labor Party exposure of industrial brainwashing operations in both the U.S. and Canada run by the United Auto Workers, the United Steelworkers, and other unions. Stephen Lewis, Ontario-based NDP hack and son of national NDP head David Lewis, could only screech, "I'm a fascist I'm a fascist!" when approached by Labor Party representatives.

A similar suicidal performance is taking place this week at the British Columbia Federation of Labour meeting. The International Woodworkers Association, dominant force in the Federation, reportedly has written to the British Columbia manpower boards demanding consultation on the fate of laid off workers.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN FISCAL CRISIS

Brought on by the unprecedented contraction of banking liquidity coordinated by the Rockefeller-controlled Federal Reserve System and the top New York money center banks, this Federal fiscal crisis in turn has exacerbated the credit crisis.
