ROCKEFELLER FORCES PUSH TOWARD NUCLEAR CONFRONTATION; ICLC SPURS COUNTERMOVES

CIA PRESS PUSHES RED-SCARE LINE

April 28 (IPS)--The New York Times and the Washington Post opened the red-scare campaign on several fronts today.

A Washington Post article entitled "Soviets change sub tactics" had no other value except to propagandize the existence of the Soviet "Doomsday" submarines and their potential effectiveness in a nuclear exchange with the United States.

SWEDISH MILITARY COORDINATES PROVOCATIONS WITH NATO

April 28 (IPS)--Swedish national TV reported Sunday that the Swedish home guard have been put on "full alert" in a so-called "simulated invasion" involving the immediate mobilization of 70,000 volunteers, the first to be called in case of war. A military spokesman has confirmed that the entire scenario was directed against a possible Soviet occupation and that the main role of Sweden was to "prevent the Warsaw Pact getting out through the Oresund channel linking the Baltic and the Atlantic." The spokesman, obviously aware of the military provocation, revealed the extremely dangerous stupidity of the middle-level Swedish pro-NATO military circles.

CONGRESS REACTS SERIOUSLY TO USLP BRIEFINGS ON ROCKEFELLER'S BRINKSMANSHIP; INFORMAL INVESTIGATION INITIATED

WASHINGTON, April 28 (IPS)--Significant sections of liberal and conservative layers in Congress today said that Rockefeller's police raid on European Labor Party headquarters in Wiesbaden, West Germany today was an "extremely serious" indication that the Labor Party analysis of Rockefeller's nuclear brinkmanship is correct. Several informed sources said that an independent, as yet informal, congressional investigation is being initiated.

NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL MEETS, MAPS BRINKSMANSHIP POLICY

April 28 (IPS)--Using the pretext of the death of two U.S. marines during a shelling of the Saigon airport, President Ford called an emergency meeting of the National Security Council this morning, ostensibly to determine whether immediate U.S. evacuation of South Vietnam was in order. Simultaneous developments indicate that the meeting was actually part of Rockefeller preparations for nuclear brinkmanship adventures, possibly centering around the Middle East.

PENTAGON OFFICIALS UNAWARE OF ACTIVATION OF ROCKEFELLER'S ENDGAME SCENARIO

April 28 (IPS)--Interviews today with various military officials confirm that except for Rockefeller circles grouped around Secretary of Defense Schlesinger, it is apparent that Department of Defense officials know absolutely nothing of the latest Rockefeller initiatives toward a tactical nuclear exchange with the Soviet Union.

BRITISH PRESS WARNS OF NEED FOR INTERVENTION IN EUROPE

April 28 (IPS)--The British press yesterday centered on the growing pressure on the United States to take a hard line against the Soviets. The Sunday Telegraph's political analyst, Peregrine Worsthorne, noted that the "necessary confidence that binds a governing class together in mutual trust has melted away..."

SWEDEN'S SOCIAL DEMS "NAG" IWMA CONFERENCE

April 28 (IPS)--Members of the Swedish Social Democratic Youth group, SSU, have informed the European Labor Committee of "rumors heard in the Social Democracy that you have Baader-Meinhof people in your group." Arising in the general context of Rockefeller moves to establish war governments in Sweden and West Germany, the rumors have specifically targetted the upcoming International Workingmen's Association Conference, scheduled to open May 3 in Gotenberg.

PRG MOVES FORCE TOTAL U.S. PULLOUT

April 29 (IPS)--The U.S. finally evacuated nearly all of its military and civilian personnel from South Vietnam yesterday, fulfilling the preconditions for negotiations with the new Saigon regime that had been laid down by the Provisional Revolutionary Government. U.S. delay in pulling had provided the major roadblock to a settlement.

TASS ATTACKS SCHLESINGER/MAD ARMS RATTLING

April 29 (IPS)-- A Tass release headlined "What Pleases the Maoists" emphasizes the adherence of Peking's leadership to the policies of U.S. Secretary of Defense James Schlesinger. The release, which appeared in the April 26 military paper "Red Star," says that Schlesinger in his recent appearance in Congress, was "frightening senators with a supposed 'Soviet threat'" in Europe, and "defending American interests" in the Mideast, Persian Gulf and

Asia.

SWEDISH GENERAL GETS WIRES CROSSED: ADMITS NATO ALERT

STOCKHOLM, April 29 (IPS)--The current "full alert" military mobilization taking place throughout Sweden was in fact prepared and implemented in the space of the last 72 hours, Swedish Commanding General Stig Synnergren has admitted in a press interview with the liberal Stockholm Daily, Dagens Nyheter. Sweden's mobilization of its entire well-organized home guard, military and civilian defense apparatus is explicitly aimed at a "Simulated Soviet invasion," and is coordinated with NATO military mobilizations throughout Europe to set the stage for a nuclear showdown with the Soviet bloc in Western Europe.

NEW MOBILIZATION AT LONDON HEATHROW

April 29 (IPS)--British government officials have ordered yet another mobilization at London's Heathrow airport--an alleged "practice exercise" to counter threats from terrorist.

LEVI URGES "SENSITIVE INFORMATION" BE WITHHELD CONGRESS

April 29 (IPS)--Delivering Rockefeller marching orders on thermonuclear war policy last night, Attorney General Edward Levi, speaking before the Association of the Bar of the City of New York demanded that "sensitive information" be withheld from Congress. Levi said: "Congress, of course, has an oversight function. But that function has never been thought to include an absolute right of access to confidential information with the possession of other branches."

NATO AGENT CLINE DISPATCHED TO IMPLEMENT "MC14/4"

April 30 (IPS)--Ray S. Cline co-director of the Georgetown Centre for Strategic and International Studies and former Deputy Director of the CIA and the State Department's German Bureau, left the United States yesterday to organize a major armtwisting campaign against key West German officials in Munich and Bonn. Cline's deployment to organize the implementation of NATO nuclear war plan, MC 14/4, follows the failure of Rockefeller Second International agent Willy Brandt to deter Labor Committee exposure of this plan and organizing against it--even by an armed police raid on ICLC Wiesbaden offices Monday.

SCHLESINGER'S NUCLEAR BRINKSMANSHIP POLICIES "ARE SURELY RIGHT"
NEW YORK TIMES SAYS

April 30 (IPS)--Asserting matter-of-factly that Defense Secretary Schlesinger's policies--insane nuclear brinkmanship--"are surely right," an op ed column by editorial board member Robert Kleiman

in today's New York Times warns that such a policy is justified because of the Soviets' "aggressive actions." "The world has suddenly become a chillier place," Kleiman declares, charging that "Soviet diplomacy, or Soviet-oriented Communist Parties" are to blame. The U.S. must maintain a strong military posture to head off the Soviets' left-wing faction, the NATO spokesman claims.

CRONKITE HINTS THAT VIETNAM LOSS WILL SPARK NUCLEAR CONFRONTATION

April 30 (IPS)--Commentator Walter Cronkite concluded a two-and-a-half hour CBS special on Vietnam last night by commenting that the likely upshot of the American loss would be the proliferation of nuclear weapons among nations which formerly felt they could rely on the U.S. for their national security.

April 30 (IPS)--Former Newsweek columnist Kenneth Crawford demonstrates today in the Washington Post how "the dominoes are in fact falling" all over the world as a result of the communist victory in Southeast Asia. Then Crawford warns that "far left" elements here "hope that the U.S. itself will be the ultimate domino."

ROCKEFELLER TRIES TO MUZZLE DEBATE ON NEW STRATEGIC DOCTRINE

April 30 (IPS)--Over the heads of Congress, the Rockefeller clique has pushed through MC 14/4, the most drastic revision that puts military doctrine in the entire post-war era: a revision that puts in jeopardy the peace and security of the United States and Western Europe. To halt Congressional debate on this dangerous strategic turn, Rockefeller is attempting to brand the Labor Party as KGB and thus forestall any review and investigation by an outright terrorist tactic against Congress.

CLARK CLIFFORD CONFIRMS THAT KISSINGER POLICY IS TWO-FRONT WAR AGAINST THE SOVIET UNION

May 1 (IPS)--Former Secretary of Defense Clark Clifford confirmed today that Henry Kissinger's policy is the creation of a "second front" war between the Soviet Union and China in the event of confrontation between NATO and Warsaw Pact forces.

"We have been engaged in that mistake for some time," the former Defense Secretary said. "I disagree with Mr. Kissinger's view of big power politics. I doubt it's effective to play the Soviet Union against red China. To maintain a relationship with China on the basis of a second front in case of a confrontation with the Soviets in Europe is a poor way to go about it."

"We might find it doesn't suit China's purposes at the time," Clifford added.

USLP ALERTS PRESS TO ROCKY'S ENDGAME MADNESS IN PRESS CONFERENCES

May 1, (IPS)--The U.S. Labor Party held press conferences in 20 major

cities yesterday to alert the nation's press and media to Rockefeller's suicidal plans for thermonuclear brinksmanship. Although the conferences were well attended, the press, with few exceptions, blacked out news of the nuclear threat.

GEN. TAYLOR ON ROCKY'S BRINKSMANSHIP. "THIS IS A HELL OF A SERIOUS SITUATION."

May] (IPS)--General Maxwell Taylor, former advisor to Presidents Kennedy and Johnson for national security affairs confirmed in an interview today that the U.S. move to establish a regional security pact in the south East Asia are is certainly "one of the patterns developing."

WEST GERMAN HINTS AT NUCLEAR THREAT IN 'SECRET STUDY'

WIESBADEN, BRD, May] (IPS)--West German radio stations today are reporting on a "secret study" which details the dangers of transporting nuclear weapons and fuel. This is part of a continuing government psychological warfare campaign on the possibility of terrorists "armed with nuclear weapons," a campaign which surfaced after the so-called terrorist kidnapping of right-wing politician Peter Lorenz in West Berlin two months ago.

KISSINGER HIDES HIS BRINKSMANSHIP FOOTWORK

May] (IPS)--Trying to cover his maneuvering for Rockefeller's nuclear brinksmanship, Secretary of State Henry Kissinger replied to a question on detente at his April 29 press conference: "detente is necessary to avoid thermonuclear war at all costs...we cannot expect the Soviet Union to support our allies. It would be a grave mistake to blame the Soviet Union for what is going on in Portugal."

ROCKEFELLER CONGRESSIONAL ARM-TWISTING TRIES TO NEUTRALIZE LABOR PARTY INFLUENCE

May] (IPS)--Rockefeller's increased Congressional arm-twisting is an attempt to neutralize Labor Party organizing against the Rockefeller forces' planned nuclear confrontation with the Soviets.

Briefed on NATO's adoption of the MC]4/4 nuclear doctrine, an aide to Senator Robert Griffin (R-Mich.), Bob Turner, declined to discuss this "highly classified subject," indicating strong pressure on the senator to avoid such discussion. The CIA's "need to know" secrecy policy is highly suspect since this subject has been the focus of national debate since the establishment of "mutually assured destruction" (MAD) policy during the Eisenhower years.

SAFIRE FLOATS TRIAL BALLOON FOR PRESIDENTIAL DICTATORSHIP

May] (IPS)--Columnist William Safire in today's New York Times proposes that "A relentless centralization of all decision making in the White House and installing puppets in the domestic depart-

ments and agencies is the only way to keep the government bureaucracy from 'leaning hard left'."

Although Safire claims that this was former President Nixon's policy, he is clearly testing for a reaction to a proposal for a Bonapartist dictatorship in the U.S. According to Safire, a major backer of such a proposal is the CIA Brookings Institute, a supporter of Rockefeller's brinksmanship.

THE REVOLUTIONARY UNION SUPPORTS ROCKEFELLER NUCLEAR WAR

May 2 (IPS)--Culminating the anti-Soviet policy initiated in January by leading CIA agent Martin Nichlaus of the Guardian, the Revolutionary Union, it was learned today, came out in support of Rockefeller's policy of nuclear confrontation and war. In their "Draft Program for the Party of the U.S. Working Class" released in April, the R.U. put forward the idea that "in launching a Third World War the imperialists, especially the rulers of the U.S. and the U.S.S.R., would further expose their barbarous nature...and give rise to a revolutionary storm shaking the world as never before."

SCHLESINGER CITES EUROPE, KOREA AS "FORWARD DEFENSE AREAS"

WASHINGTON, May 2 (IPS)--Defense Secretary Schlesinger, in comments made at a Pentagon press conference yesterday, demarcated the areas for a two-front confrontation with the Soviet Union. In response to questions on the effect of the U.S. defeat in Indochina, Schlesinger said it was an "inopportune time" to think of any major re-deployment of U.S. military forces overseas and stressed that "the forward defense areas must continue to be Western Europe and Korea, and, indirectly, Japan."

JAPAN TO BE SET UP AS NUCLEAR TARGET IN ENDGAME

May 2 (IPS)--In a move which would make Japan a target in U.S. Defense Secretary Schlesinger's "endgame" tactical nuclear warfare scenario, right-wingers dominating the executive board of Japan's ruling Liberal Democratic Party are fighting to authorize stationing United States nuclear weapons in Japan in "emergencies." The LDP hawks are demanding the measure in return for passage of the nuclear non-proliferation treaty. Since the U.S. atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the Japanese have refused to allow nuclear weapons on Japanese soil. According to the Asahi Evening News, the LDP hawks said that the defeat of the U.S. in Indochina, together with the passage of the NPT, would make the U.S. nuclear deterrent ineffective unless Japan is more "flexible" about the introduction of nuclear weapons into Japan.

MCGOVERN DEMANDS HALT TO NUCLEAR WAR PLANS OF SCHLESINGER AND KISSINGER

May2 (IPS)--In a major speech, yesterday Senator George McGovern made an historic contribution to the U.S. Labor Party's demand that

immediate public debate be opened on Rockefeller's and Schlesinger's insane activation of NATO's MC 14/4 orders for nuclear war. McGovern released the speech to the press, after he was unable to deliver it on the senate floor. Although he stressed that there is little time to act against imminent nuclear confrontation, to date there has been a complete press black-out on his remarks.

In a frontal attack on Schlesinger's "counterforce" doctrine, McGovern said: "The lesson should be clear: We must know by now that neither side will agree to reductions on the basis of what the other side has done. Bargaining chips only move the game to a higher and more dangerous plateau..."

Throwing his weight behind Schlesinger's leading conservative critic, the liberal McGovern continued, "The chairman of the research and development subcommittee of the Senate Armed Services Committee, Mr. McIntyre, has suggested the proper course in his response to counterforce weapons and planning. He has noted that silo busting weapons put a "hairtrigger" on nuclear war and that programs to further increase accuracy can only threaten more arms competition. We should welcome and heed his leadership on that issue."

FRENCH AND GERMAN SOURCES CONFIRM NUCLEAR THREAT COMING FROM U.S. NATO FORCES

May 2 (IPS)--Highly-placed sources in the office of the French Chief of Staff and in the West German Ministry of Defense have confirmed to New Solidarity International Press Service that a minority faction in the United States government and NATO is presently pushing for immediate thermonuclear confrontation with Warsaw Pact forces.

In an interview April 30, a high officer close to France's Chief of Staff revealed that French troops are being kept "as far away as possible" from the East so as to make possible French disengagement from any conflict which might occur as a result of "some form of provocation."

In West Germany, a high official in the Ministry of Defense informed IPS this morning that "there are circles in the U.S. who are for this (thermonuclear war)."

TASS REITERATES: PEKING IN THE IMPERIALIST CAMP

May 4 (IPS)--The Soviet News Agency Tass reported May 2 that there were no May Day demonstrations of workers in Peking this year--as there have not been in recent years. Instead, commented Tass, "The Peking press continued to come out with anti-Soviet slanderous articles, to publish provocational materials, and grossly distort the Soviet peace policy in Asia, Europe, the Mideast and other regions of the world. Simultaneously, Chinese newspapers are campaigning for strengthening imperialist military blocs and egging the capitalist countries on in the arms race."

HONNECKER DEMANDS PREVENTION OF WAR

May 4 (IPS)--Erich Honnecker, First Secretary of the ruling Socialist Unity Party (SED) of East Germany, contributed an article to-

list Unity Party (SED) of East Germany, contributed an article today to the Soviet Daily Pravda, on the 30th anniversary of the Soviet Army's victory over fascism. On the present world situation, Honnecker said that the enemies of detente are "becoming more active and undertaking dangerous initiatives." Every effort, wrote Nonnecker, must be made to prevent the danger of a new world war.

HANOI DENOUNCES SCHLESINGER: DEMANDS U.S. PULL OUT OF KOREA

May 3 (IPS)--The official News Agency of North Vietnam today described U.S. Secretary Schlesinger as "a typical propagator of the wars of U.S. imperialism." The Vietnamese demanded an immediate pullout of U.S. troops stationed in South Korea stating that "there cannot be any possible pretext for the aggressive imperialist forces of the U.S. to remain any longer in South Korea."
