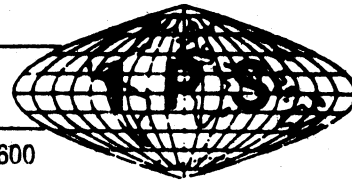

"ARABS KEEN ON GOLD," SWISS BANKER REPORTS

ZURICH, June 10 (NSIPS)—"The Arabs are keen for gold," one of the top executives of a major Swiss bank said today. He had just returned from a tour of the Middle East during which he was selling gold to the Arabs. "Privately, of course, you know, (U.S. Federal Reserve Chairman) Burns is for gold, but he can't say so officially," he added.

ITALIAN SOCIALIST PARTY PAPER REPORTS SOME EUROPEAN COUNTRIES READY TO BACK NEW WORLD ECONOMIC ORDER

June 10 (NSIPS)—Avanti, the Italian Socialist Party daily, yesterday reported that Switzerland and the Scandinavian and Mediterranean countries of Europe have "stated that they are getting ready with an open spirit for future negotiations" on the world economy following the deadlock at the Nairobi United Nations Conference on Trade and Development meeting, "even if (these negotiations are) difficult and long, with the strict understanding that they are contributing to the creation of the instruments aimed at bringing into being the new world economic order." Avanti further stated that it was only pressure from the pro-Atlanticist Great Britain and West Germany that prevented the Common Market group at Nairobi from giving support to a new world economic order. "Once again," said Avanti, because of British and West German opposition, "history has called at Europe's door and Europe has not answered."

PCF CALLS ON GAULLISTS TO JOIN MASS POPULAR MOVEMENT

June 10 (NSIPS)—In an editorial statement in yesterday's L'Humanite, newspaper of the French Communist Party (PCF), Charles Sylvestre issued a call to the "orthodox" elements within the Gaullist (UDR) party to join with the PCF in a new mass popular movement to defeat President Giscard d'Estaing and his renegade Gaullist Prime Minister Jacques Chirac.

The Sylvestre statement follows indications from this weekend's closed-door session between the President and his Prime Minister of a compromise reached between Chirac's Gaullists and the

government around the questions of national defense and a much disputed speculative gains tax. Criticizing the hard line Gaullists for doing no more than raising the "standard of revolt" and then "going to bed," Sylvestre insists that "the domestication of the UDR (at Chirac's hands) underlines with force that the national charge of Gaullism needs to be rediscovered in the assembling of popular forces."

PCF Secretary General Marchais echoed the same line in a national broadcast by stating that the Gaullists and the PCF "can fight together" on defense questions.

FRENCH TAX BILL SPLITS GISCARD'S PARTY

June 10 (NSIPS)—Many deputies from France's Independent Republican party (RI)—the party of Atlanticist President Giscard d'Estaing—agree with the Gaullists in the UDR party that Giscard will wreck his majority coalition if his promotion of anti-industrial-capital reforms is not stopped, according to this week's issue of the magazine *Le Point*. Finance Minister Fourcade, the author of a tax on profits bill which is adamantly opposed by the Gaullists, threatened the RI deputies last week prior to the parliamentary debate with expulsion from the party should any one of them vote against the bill.

According to *Le Point*, Prime Minister Chirac, an opportunist renegade from the Gaullists ranks, is now in a "dilemma" because of rumblings of revolt against the President in the UDR's ranks.

TERRORISTS MURDER GENOA'S GENERAL ATTORNEY OF THE REPUBLIC

June 10 (NSIPS)—Dr. Francesco Coco, General Attorney of the Republic in the Italian City of Genoa, was murdered June 8 by a gang of terrorists in Genoa. The gang also assassinated Coco's chauffeur and a personal guard.

Authorities have not revealed yet any information on the murders, but by late evening June 8 at least three "right" and "left" terrorist organizations, including the infamous "Red brigades" and the "New Partisans" and the fascist "Avanguardia Nazionale" were allegedly claiming credit for the killings. All of the terrorist groups who left messages for the press in conspicuous places stated that Coco's murder is not the last, but one of a series that is to continue.

ITALIAN INTERIOR MINISTRY SLATES MASSIVE POLICE MOBILIZATION FOLLOWING ELECTIONS

June 10 (NSIPS)—According to the latest issue of the Italian weekly *L'Espresso*, Italian Minister of the Interior Armando Cossiga

advised some of his closest collaborators that "if anything big is going to happen it will be June 22-23," in reference to the recent wave of violence in Italy, which is expected to escalate immediately after the June 20 elections. The magazine also reports that Cossiga has prepared a mobilization plan for those two key days: He will deploy 80,000 carabinieri, 78,000 police, and 30,000 fiscal police. As to where the violence is likely to originate, the magazine reports that the purportedly left-wing organization Lotta Continua, has been found to have links to Libya and the terrorist Irish Republican Army. It also reveals that Lotta Continua is perhaps the easiest group to infiltrate, and its membership includes carabinieri, police agents, and fascists.

CIA TERRORISTS LAUNCH TWO ATTACKS IN MEXICO CITY IN 6 HOUR PERIOD

MEXICO CITY, June 10 (NSIPS)—Terrorists of the Mexican "23rd of September League" carried out two attacks on the outskirts of this city in a period of less than 6 hours June 8. The "23rd League"—widely identified during the last year by progressive political and press circles and by the Mexican Labor Party as a CIA controlled gang—has stepped up its attacks during the last five days following an attack last Friday in which six policemen were killed.

In the latest incidents, three terrorists who were surprised painting 23rd of September slogans on the walls of the Aceros Nacionales Steel plant and the Campos Hermanos machine tool plant both located on the outskirts of Mexico City, opened fire on a police patrol on the early morning of June 8. No one was injured and the terrorists made a safe getaway, according to the June 8 Mexico City press. The Campos Hermanos plant has been the site of organizing by the Mexican labor Party during the past three months.

In a second incident a police guard station in the southern part of Mexico City was shot at yesterday morning by individuals identified as members of the 23rd League. The attack was reported in the June 8 evening daily, Ultimas Noticias.

MILITARY THREATS AGAINST GUYANA DENOUNCED BY LATIN PEACE CONFERENCE

June 10 (NSIPS)—The First Latin American and Caribbean Conference of National Peace Movements has denounced the "danger of aggression that threatens Guyana incited by Yankee Imperialism." The conference denunciation stated that "among the tactics of imperialism is that of using a 'principal partner' such as Brazil, to function as 'American Policeman.'"

The Conference, which concluded its deliberations yesterday in Bogota, Colombia added, that in addition to Brazil's role as policeman, the U.S. also pushes other countries that share borders with Guyana, "to use military actions against that country

in order to prevent its development along socialist principles." According to the Cuban news service, Prensa Latina, the Conference approved a unanimous resolution declaring June 16 "International Solidarity Day iwth Guyana."

The World @Peace Council will send an international delegation to Guyana on June 16 to convey the decision of the Conference to the people of that country, according to Prensa Lajina.

GUYANA DESTABILIZATION PLAYS ON RACIAL DIVISIONS

June 10 (NSIPS)—The destabilization attempt against Guyana is trying to use racial issues to divide the Guyanese people, Shirley Field-Ridley, Guyana's Minister of Information and Cultural matters, charges. The Minister made her charges in an interview with the Cuban news agency Prensa Latina which was released yesterday.

Ms. Field-Ridley referred to the anti-Guyanese attacks that are being published by the press in that country, stating that "the rumors that circulate within the country are not generated by (Guyanese) nationals." She adds that "if we can eliminate those foreign influences that provoke coups using the (racial) divisions, then we will be out of danger."

Acknowledging that the country's main ethnic groups, East Indians and blacks, have not always lived in harmony the Minister said, "We must recognize that the concept of culture includes ideology and values." However, she added, "these divisions that are exacerbated by the anti-Guyana campaign disappear under socialism...when we work together in development projects."

PERUVIAN ECONOMIC OFFICIAL CONFERS WITH ROCKEFELLER OPERATIVES

June 10 (NSIPS)—The head of the Peruvian Ministry of Social Property (CONAPS, a defined sector of the economy), Angel de las Casas, met in Washington last week for a strategy session with top representatives of the Organization of American States, Inter-American Development Bank, the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank and the David Rockefeller-run Council on the Americas, according to the Peruvian daily La Prensa. Under cover of discussions to arrange "technical aid" financing for social property, industrial and agricultural projects, de la Casas also met with the Latin American Director for the Agency for International Development, and top Kissinger advisor Luigi Einaudi, who developed the Rand Corporation scenario for a "Second War of the Pacific." De las Casas could not be reached for comment on the discussions.

CIA RESPONSIBLE FOR BOMBING OF CUBAN UN MISSION CUBA CHARGES

June 10 (NSIPS)—The Cuban Permanent Representative to the UN has accused the CIA of being responsible for the bombing of the Cuban UN mission on Saturday, June 5. Ambassador Ricardo Alarcon

said that the bombing "was not the first time that those bankrolled by the CIA blatantly announce their intentions to undertake attempts against the lives of the representatives of the Cuban Revolutionary Government."

The Ambassador's declaration, transmitted yesterday by the Cuban news service Prensa Latina, stressed that, "in none of these attempts have any actions been taken by the American authorities to apprehend and punish the felons." Alarcon added that "the behavior of the U.S. government is a blatant violation of its commitments as host country."

Alarcon indicated that the atmosphere conducive to these attempts was created by "the aggressive, irresponsible and cynical statements made recently against Cuba by the principal leaders of imperialism, including key government and diplomatic leaders of the U.S."

CANADIAN ENVIRONMENTALISTS PRESS PHONY TERRORISM SCARE

June 10 (NSIPS)—In a broadcast aired prominently on Swedish radio yesterday, a spokesman for the environmentalist group, Green Peace, claimed knowledge of a black market for Plutonium which terrorists could use to acquire enough nuclear material to poison a major city's water supply. Patrick Moore, the spokesman, claimed that the group knew of contacts, prices, drop-off points and deliveries but would not provide any specific information. Moore's warning about poisoning water supplies is identical to a warning issued by Institute for Policy Studies-linked muckraker Ralph Nader last week in reference to the dangers of nuclear power.

VVAW OCCUPIES STATUE OF LIBERTY

NEW YORK, JUNE 10 (NSIPS)—15 members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, created by the Institute for Policy Studies for U.S. Military Intelligence operations, two days ago seized the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor under the slogans of the terrorist July 4th "Bicentennial" movement, "Get off our backs!" The VVAW members who are allied with the July 4th group and the Maoist Revolutionary Union, have barricaded themselves into the monument and then hid from the US Park Service officers who went looking for them.

President Ford will spend several hours in New York City on July 4 for Bicentennial celebrations.

REAGAN TO PUSH HARD FOR PARTY UNITY

WASHINGTON, D.C., June 10 (NSIPS)—A Reagan for President Committee

(MORE)

spokesman said last night that Ronald Reagan will be "pushing very hard for the unity of the Republican Party." According to CBS radio yesterday, Reagan said that now that the primaries are over, he and President Ford should refrain from any divisive attacks against one another and that party unity is of the utmost importance.

ROCKEFELLER WARNS AMERICANS TO TAKE CARE IN TELEPHONE CONVERSATIONS

June 10 (NSIPS)—Speaking to the National Broadcast Editorial Association yesterday, "Vice-President Rockefeller warned Americans to be more careful of what they say on the telephone for fear someone else might be listening in," according to a UPI release in today's New York Daily News.

"He said that it could be either a foreign intelligence agent or an unsavory American element, otherwise unidentified," the article stated. Rockefeller also warned "that monitoring and recording could involve wholesale invasion of privacy by organized crime, other information seekers or could be for blackmail, hijacking or terrorist purposes," the article said. It quoted the Vice President as stating: "The President is deeply concerned about this problem and is taking steps to reduce the vulnerability of our telecommunications system."
