

The surprise naming of Henry Kissinger to head the President's Bipartisan Commission on Central America is part of a longstanding attempt to subvert the Reagan presidency. Henry Kissinger's return to official life is far more significant than the Central American appointment would suggest.

This two-part study by **EIR** Washington bureau chief Richard Cohen is essential reading for any citizen concerned with the future of the United States as a republic. Part One was written in late 1982, long before anyone else recognized the Kissinger operation. It documents the monthslong process of inserting, with the friendly offices of Secretary of State George Shultz, "Kissinger's boys" throughout the administration. Part Two analyzes recent developments, including Kissinger's boast at a cocktail party in Israel, just before his nomination to the Commission, that "within two weeks I will be back in government; within a short period after that, I will be running the government."
